

JULY 6, 1926 (Tuesday)

The Claims had not been signed by the finance committee and the Pay roll was ordered read by the Mayor. It was moved by Councilman Orlander seconded by Badger that they be allowed and warrants ordered drawn.

All councilmen voted in the affirmative.

The Clerk asked for authority to pay the claim for School Rent, Harriman Bank building, and it was moved by Councilman Badger seconded by Orlander that same be paid.

Upon calling the roll all councilmen present voted in the affirmative.

It was thereafter moved by Councilman Hofman seconded by Thoday, that the balance of claims be allowed and warrants ordered drawn, when same were approved by the finance committee.

Upon calling the roll, all councilmen present voted Aye.

It was called to the attention of the council that the deeds for certain Jesse Lee lots, promised to them by the city were at present in the hands of the bank of Seward. that \$105.50 were due thereon, that deeds were made out to L. V. Ray as trustee.

After discussion it was moved by Councilman Hofman seconded by Badger, that if City attorney found same to be in proper form and legal, the warrant necessary be ordered drawn to obtain possession of the lots mentioned, being \$105.50.

Upon calling the roll. all councilmen present voted Yes.

The Mayor addressed the council on matters that had been presented for the consideration of the Common Council as follows:
